Mined Sites is the rather workaday title for a small exhibition of brilliantly fresh little paintings by young Toronto painter Suzanne Nacha. Her paintings are ostensibly based on dizzying aerial views of the dead-tech factories and machines associated with the mining industry. The fact is, by using the strange, putty-coloured paint she favours to daub her holding tanks and belt feeders and flotation cells into place on her equally puttycoloured backgrounds, she ends up with dreamy, remote, aloof arrangements of tiny ambiguous objects, lost in immensity and engulfed in a strikingly poignant, relentless light.
